# On the Other Side a poem in couplets

### Some poetry terms:

A **couplet** is a stanza with 2 lines in it.

A **stanza** is a verse, that has space above and below it – or, you can think of it as a poetry paragraph.

Poetry is separated into **lines** – you can think of lines like sentences, but without having to put a period. Often, poets don't use any punctuation at all.

### Writing assignment:

<u>Write a poem in couplets</u> "On the Other Side". Keep going until you have at least 10 couplets. Make up a title when you're done – and don't forget to put your name on your poem.
